- Do films have to be on a particular topic or genre?

No. Films can be in any style or on any topic, but must not breach copyright, defamation or anti-discrimination laws.

We would particularly encourage topics dealing with young people and their relationships with the community they live in, good and bad.

- What format should my film be in?

All entries should be submitted on DVD. Short films should be a maximum of 5 Minutes and Animations a maximum on 60 Seconds.

- Age group

12 – 25 years old, inclusive. Judging will be in the following age groupings 12 – 14, 15 – 19 and 20 – 25. Judging will be conducted by an independent panel whose decision is final.

Prizes will be awarded to the winners of each category.
