





What is L2P?

The Central Grampians L2P Learner Driver Mentor Program is Funded by the Transport Accident Commission (TAC) and Managed by VicRoads.

This FREE program was developed after the introduction of the Graduated Licencing System and the 120-logged driving hours for Learner Drivers.



The aim of the L2P program is to reduce the number of young-driver fatalities by giving learner drivers supervised experience in many different driving environments and situations, building self confidence, trust and safety on our roads.

The L2P Program assists disadvantaged Learner Drivers between the ages of 16-20 years, who have limited access to a suitable vehicle, or, Fully Licenced Supervising Driver to gain the required 120-logged driving hours and to master the skills required to gain their Probationary Licence.

Why we need Mentor's

Victorian Learner Drivers aged 16-20 are required by law to complete 120 hours of logged Supervised Driving experience. As some young people do not have access to a vehicle or Supervising Driver it is critical that we have Trained Mentors to assist eligible Learners during this period. The Mentors involved in the L2P Program are crucial for the program's success.

Role of the Supervising Driver/Mentor

The role of a Supervising Driver/Mentor is to offer coaching, support and guidance to the Learner Driver as they move through the 4 Stages of Driving and learn the skills required to become a safe, fully licenced driver.

Supervised Driving sessions are complimented with professional driving lessons which the Mentor may also attend.

The 4 Stages of Driving

Professional Lesson

STAGE 1: Controlling the Car

STAGE 2: Driving on quiet low speed Roads

Professional Lesson to assess readiness to move to stage 3

STAGE 3: Complex Driving Situations

Professional Lesson to assess readiness to move to Stage 4

STAGE 4: Rehearsing Solo Driving

Professional lesson to assess readiness for Probationary Licence Test

Car Control Skills

Car Control skills are the main focus point for Learner Drivers. It is vital that Learners gain experience in the following areas:

- Car Handling
- Hazard Identification
- Speed Control
- Safe Distances
- Complex Driving Situations
- Solo Driver Training
- Night Driving

Eligibility

To be eligible all Mentors must:

- Hold a full Victorian Drivers Licence
- Complete a Victorian Police Check
- Complete a Working with Children Check
- Complete a satisfactory VicRoads Driver History Check
- Attend 3 L2P Mentor Training Sessions covering basic road rules, crash statistics, tips on how to be a good Mentors and hands on participation in an in-car session to practice these learned skills.

*All costs related to completing these requirements will be covered by the L2P Program
